Celebration of Miss Hirose's Life!



We had to say farewell to Miss Yoshiko Hirose, who passed away on 22nd July at the age of 102 at the Olympia Old People's Home. The wake and funeral were held at the same place attended by only the immediate family members due to Covid-19. From SMIS, Tazu Makino and the writer were the sole attendees.

Miss Hirose's 100th birthday was held at the hotel near her Home two years ago. She was delighted to see so many familiar faces come from far and wide. And we were hoping to host her 101st and 102nd birthday parties at the same venue; however, that could not happen due to the pandemic.

Miss Hirose was born on 20th May 1919 in Himeji. Her father was a Japanese Anglican pastor who had graduated from Keio University in Tokyo. It was extremely rare in those days for a Keio graduate to join the divinity world. His many sons followed their father's footsteps and became clergies. His eldest daughter Naomi became a missionary. The writer met her at a church in Okayama when he visited

Miss Dulcie Brown, a USPG missionary who had previously taught Bible and Sunday School at SMIS. Thanks to her tutelage, the writer became a Christian.

Miss Hirose attended Shoin Girls' School from year 7 to 12 and lived in the school dormitory. After Shoin, she continued her studies at a junior college and was asked by Miss Lea to teach in December 1945, when she opened her Kitanocho home to international students in the morning and to Japanese students in the afternoon.

When St. Michael's International School officially opened on 10th March 1946, all the students and teachers marched on the snow-covered road to the newly erected school building from Miss Lea's house. Among the group was Miss Hirose, who was to be the writer's home room teacher when he entered the School in 1949.

When Miss Hirose went to England to study in 1953, she was invited to attend Queen Elizabeth II's coronation ceremony. However, she felt her clothing was not adequate since her Sunday best had gone astray in the process of transportation and regrettably decided not to attend. At the ceremony, the Archbishop of Canterbury Geoffrey Fisher wore a cope which was a gift from the Japanese Anglican Church whose Primate then was Bishop Michael Yashiro who together with Miss Lea founded St. Michael's International School.

Students at SMIS went to see the film of the coronation and the writer vividly remembers when the Archbishop appeared on the scene wearing the Japanese gift. The same Archbishop visited Kobe in 1959 and dedicated St. Michael's Cathedral. A large picnic was held in the Shoin playground to share the joy of the Archbishop's visit to the Kansai area.

Upon returning to Japan, Miss Hirose resumed teaching at SMIS while assisting Miss Lea in various capacities. After Miss Lea passed away in October 1971, Miss Hirose became the Acting Principal till Miss Ruth Crawford Brown became Principal in 1972.

Miss Hirose dedicated most of her life to education at St. Michael's as the Deputy Head and will remain in the hearts of many students who had the privilege of meeting her.
